There are 10 qualities of an official listed on page 2-2 of the HCOP Manual (Attitude, Feel fro the Game, Fitness/Nutrition, Judgement/Consistency/Standard, Positioning, Presence and Awareness, Rapport,/Communication, Reaction to Pressure, Rule Knowledge, Signals, Skating Ability). True or False. Many officials focus on just one or two of these qualities and do not have an full view of their development.

- True. Officials need to consider all the qualities of an official but often are really focused on just a few.
- False. There are only a few qualities that



are really important like penalty selection.

**At the end of the game, the buzzer goes. In the Three-Official System, the referee should...(HWRD Resources, HCOP 4-5)**

Correct

- a) get as close to the players as possible to break up any scrums
- b) stay far away to see everything
- c) take up a position on the ice to see as much as possible but still maintain presence by being close enough to talk to the players on the ice



**During a fight in the Three-Official System, the first thing the referee should do is...(HWRD Resources, HCOP 4-6)**

- "In all non-hitting games, a CFB does not require an additional suspension."
- "I am sorry coach, I can only call what happens on the ice. Once the game is over suspensions are dealt with by the Division Director. Please call the Division Director for more information."
- "A17 needs to serve 1 Game if it is his first offense, 2 Games for second offense, 3 games for third and is indefinitely suspended if this is his fourth CFB."



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
